- 7.1 Innovations introduced during this academic year which have created a positive impact on the functioning of the institution. Give details.
  - 'The Green Campus Clean Campus programme' was effectively implemented. In connection with this, IQAC conducted awareness programme and took initiatives to minimize the use of plastic items in the college. Moreover, the students lead a 'no flex and no plastics' campaign.
  - Special Coaching programmes were conducted to improve the academic performance of the students. Slower and advanced learners were identified through internal examinations. Remedial Coaching was conducted for slower students whereas special training and coaching programmes for competitive examinations were conducted for advanced learners.
- 7.2 Provide the Action Taken Report (ATR) based on the plan of action decided upon at the beginning of the year
  - The college is included in the 'project for developing infrastructure and converting them into Centers of Excellence' using funds to be provided by Kerala Infrastructure Investment Fund Board (KIIFB), by the Government of Kerala
  - Administrative sanction for an amount of ca. 8.73 lakhs was given to undertake infrastructure development projects such as construction of a new academic building, augmentation of library, construction of a centralized computer lab, renovation of language lab etc.
  - An amount of 3.00 crores sanctioned by the Government was deposited with the KITE for the construction of Library Block
  - An amount of 2.70 crores (70 lakhs from RUSA fund and 2 crores from special plan fund) was deposited with the PWD for the construction of Administration Building

#### 7.3 Give two Best Practices of the institution

- Weekly Talk by teachers: Teachers are potential scholars and the best evaluators. With the view of creating a platform for teachers to develop their professional skills as effective speakers, IQAC plans to implement 'Weekly Talk' programme as one of the best practices of the institution. In this programme, in every week, a teacher selects his/her favorite topic and conducts a lecture to the entire teaching community of the college, so that every teacher is exposed to a new topic in every week.
- Class Guide and Mentor System: In this programme, each teacher is assigned about 15 students. The tutors understand the personal and academic background of their students and monitor the academic programmes of them. IQAC conducts periodic review meetings of the mentors. This practice would definitely enhance the academic performance of students by improving the self-confidence, learning and personality development of students.
